PARISH VESTRY MEETING MINUTES: October 17, 2019

Rev. Johanna called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

#1 Rev. Johanna led the Pilgrim Program, Session Six: Do you renounce evil?

#2 Reviewed September 19, 2019 vestry minutes

*Noted revisions are as follow:

Item #3- Steve Gaddes' update should read that he spoke with Kristine Gregory—not Kristine Canepa.

Item # 3--Placemat for Turkey Supper update should read: Typesetting of the placemats can "no longer" be a donation by Andy Vanable.

Item #4-Hurricane Dorian: correct typos "effected" and "effective" to "affected" and "affective."

Item #4-Resignation letter from "Cindy Avery" should be changed to "Cindy Averill."

Item #4-"Alter Guild" should be changed to "Altar Guild."

Item #4-Turkey Supper Sunday: Eliminate the word "Mass" after Eucharist.

Item #4-Kitchen/Vault organization: "Justin Greenhow" should be "Justin Greenough."

Item #5-Stewardship Report: Should read "Stewardship Campaign" instead of "Stewardship Drive."

Item #7- Typo in the word "Treasurer's" was corrected.

Item #7-(RE: thrift store): "Shirley Liptrot" should read "Priscilla Liptrot."

Item #7-(RE: food closet) "Gene" should read "Jane."

Item #7- "Scholorship" should read "Scholarship."

Item #7-Susan clarified that she is not recommending that we take out a loan to pay the balance of the traffic light...she is saying that if we need to use the funds in the restricted account, then we would need to take out a loan."

Item #7-First Motion at the bottom should read "Motion to commit..." instead of "Motion to continue..."

Ministry Fair Outtakes: "Additional hangings" should read "Additional bulletin boards."

Ministry Fair Outtakes: "New Comer's dinner" should read "Newcomers' Dinner."

Motion to accept minutes from September, 2019 meeting, as amended. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

#3 Follow up items:

•Update on Traffic Safety Committee communications—Chief Delaere told Kris Gregory that his contact at the DOT has sent our request for an engineering study on Danielson Pike to the appropriate personnel at the DOT.

•Advertising/Website -- The bazaar is 12/6 and 12/7. We can do the "Calendar of bazaars" page, which has 8 bazaars to a page in full color and it is free.

We have approximately \$956 left for advertising expenses. Jill Shurtleff believes the price of advertising in the Observer is \$225/week for a 1/4 page for one area, which covers Cumberland Lincoln, North Smithfield, North Providence, Scituate/Foster/Glocester. She recommends we stay with Scituate area \$225/week. Two areas cost an additional \$150, for a total of \$375. If we decide to go with a second area, we should go to North Providence area. It is \$5 more for an internet ad. For two areas, plus the internet it would be \$380. Jill is going to confirm the pricing. We could also do one week of a 1/4 page ad for the bazaar and one week for the Christmas services.

To advertise our Christmas services in the Foster Home Journal it is \$119. Susan crunched the numbers and determined that we only have \$200 left so we have to be careful.

Motion to take out one ad for bazaar covering two areas with the \$5 more for internet, and Foster Home Journal for church services. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

• Everyone liked the letter to the Ministry Chairs regarding articles

Motion to approve letter for chairs and co-chairs. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

•The updated rental form was reviewed. It has already been approved.

•Blessing jars-We have eight left that have not been counted yet. They will be counted after Oct. 30 when Nancy Paradee comes to take pictures of the Blessing Jars for an article which will feature Trinity and the Blessing Jars in the next edition of Risen.

•Christmas Memorial Donations—The Vestry has voted to approve the change to the memorial so we just need to let the congregation know. Susan will come up with a notice.

•EFM fee—Jim has not received an update on the fee. Will the diocese cover Donna Tornatore's training?

Senior Warden's Time:

Graham Hall-At the last meeting we discussed the potential for moving the food pantry and the thrift shop to Graham Hall. The plan would be to move the food pantry out of the Undercroft and make the Undercroft the library/meeting space. Sunday school, thrift shops, and pantry would share space. Steve invited feedback on pros and cons.

•<u>Pro</u>: Connection to the food closet and the identification with the church. Trinity church is more visible than the current location of the thrift shop.

•Pro: We do not need to worry about PWSB.

•<u>Pro</u>: We could eliminate the cost of rent and utilities at the current location. The thrift shop has a considerable electric bill in the winter.

•<u>Pro</u>: Discussion about the current thrift shop location being damp and people may not be able to volunteer because of breathing issues. Many voiced their opinions that if the breathing issues were resolved then some of the people who were not able to volunteer at the current location will be able to volunteer if it were moved to Trinity.

•<u>Pro</u>: New location would be handicap accessible.

•<u>Con</u>: Levond met with Sandy Owens in thrift shop. Sandy has concerns with location (current location closer to town center) and lack of traffic, as well as volunteers needed for the bigger space (but see above regarding more people would volunteer if breathing issue resolved). (She also had concerns about rent and utilities but it seems that she is not aware that there would be no such cost).

Possible clarification needed: Jean Grover at food closet said larger space is pro AND con because we would need more money to fill up with food, but she did not understand that in big space they would be expected to have the same inventory.

Other issues: Steve will check with zoning board to see if we can do this without town approval. May need a special use permit. May need to check with fire department if we take walls down, etc.

•Discussion regarding how to accommodate the Christmas bazaar with the thrift shop.

Rector's Time:

Johanna asked for volunteers to research whether applying for a grant from the UTO to help with pay for the cost of relocating the thrift shop and the food closet would be appropriate. UTO grants must be approved by the Bishop before they are written. Deb Luchka volunteered to work with Esther Plouffle on researching grants.

Finance committee--Senior warden assumes the chair. Is active beginning of November for about 6 weeks from start to finish from various committees. It is a learning opportunity. Time is generally 6:30-9:00 once a week. Several names were suggested.

Nominating committee--Levond, Megan and Jim Segovis are outgoing members. We need three (3) other members of the parish who are not members of the vestry. Several names were suggested.

•Renewal of insurance policy: Steve as Senior Warden will have the phone conversation with the insurance company.

•Office Administrator hours: Johanna requested additional office administrative hours for the 2020 budget. We have a new treasurer coming in next year. In order to get the office organized Susan took on more responsibilities than are normally belonging to the Treasurer, so Johanna would like to put that time back on the office administrator. She is asking the Vestry for an additional 2 hours per week, from 16 to 18 hours (which would preclude insurance costs).

Johanna feels the additional cost incurred by the increase in hours for the office administrator may be covered by a change in the cost of her healthcare. As the details of the cost and coverage of healthcare for 2020 are examined, she will be in conversation with the Finance committee.

•Gift: Jane Gaddes' grandchildren would like to gift Trinity \$500 in honor of Janes' 90th birthday. The family has asked if Trinity has anything that we need or would like to have, and they would like a plaque to honor her birthday. Jane is a big advocate for summer camps. Ideas include a new tabernacle or a banner. Johanna will present ideas to Rachel.

•CDC (Congregational Development Committee) grants: Someone needs to go on line and look at this and see if we can get money. The Bishop has suggested we might want to apply for a grant to clean up the labyrinth and get a program going around the labyrinth.

•International Day of Prayer: Chris Martel would like to address the congregation about the International Day of Prayer on Nov. 3. He is going to step in as guest preacher on October 26 and 27 to share information that we may not know about how Christians are persecuted around the world.

Audrey Hebert is selling touchstone jewelry and would like to advertise that she will donate her commission of 10% to the church. This is an online event.

Motion was made to tell Audrey that the vestry does not wish to pursue this at this time and will revisit the idea in the spring. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

Motion to establish a community type bulletin board where people can advertise their personal hobbies, jobs, etc. Someone needs to be in charge of it. Motion tabled as no interest in ownership of the bulletin board.

Treasurer's report:

•Proceeds from the turkey supper go under fundraising. We do not have an idea yet on the number.

•Income from 20-week club was a couple hundred dollars over budget.

•Johanna's Letter of Agreement/Social Security Allowance discussion: Susan explained the difference in the budget vs. actual report. Our current budget does not have a line item number for Social Security Allowance. In 2018 we should have put money aside and paid a social security allowance, but we did not. So, we owe \$4392.86 in Social Security taxes based on Johanna's contract. Susan did not see the contract and so it was not done in 2018. Clergy are independent contractors and responsible for paying their own Social Security. Letters of Agreement are written so that church pays half and clergy members pay the other half of the Social Security Tax. Johanna's base salary was inflated by that much to accommodate Trinity's portion of the social security tax. She was not aware that Trinity had not paid

half of social security until her accountant told her she owed the other half. The \$4,392.86 has been paid for 2018 and Trinity will owe half of 2019 social security taxes as well. Johanna may get assessed a penalty because she is behind and will ask the church to cover that as well.

Susan has not had the audit done. Goal is to get done by end of year.

Motion to accept the treasurer's report for audit. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

Stewardship report:

Jim: The first letter went out today from Rev. Johanna. Jim will send one at the end of the month and Steve as Sr. Warden will send one after that.

Discussion regarding Second Sunday breakfast with facilitators; people will talk about why they come to Trinity and get value from Trinity.

Property Report:

Building and grounds committee: We need three storm doors at the rectory. Home depot does not make good storm doors, so the committee has decided on Pella doors. We budgeted up to \$2K and only spent \$115.88 because that committee has donated the work. For the painting that has already been done, we used the building fund and the memorial fund. The storm doors are \$1500 total with installation.

Motion to take funds from general building funds/general operating account to buy and have installed 3 storm doors. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

John Holmes strongly suggests that the gutters are cleaned before it snows. It will cost a couple hundred dollars. Susan said he has \$1000 to use.

John Holmes is going to mark the driveway and have the snow pushed further down so it does not block the garbage area.

John Morgan donated a floor washer. John Holmes is in the process of repairing it. Has a budget for repair. It is \$54 for a squeegee apparatus.

John Morgan approached Johanna about the front of the rectory. He would like to use weed killers and treat it properly. He has asked that we let him do it before we take any other steps. Johanna's concern is that it is a very labor-intensive garden, but John assured her that he would take care of that problem. Per Susan he only has about \$120 available for landscaping.

Mr. O'Brien has taken the nameplate down and will make a new one.

Motion to accept Frank Marzano's offer of labor and materials to add electrical outlets in the vault storage room. Motion seconded, all agreed, no opposed. Motion passed.

John wants to paint the last room upstairs. He needs a color.

Balance Sheet Items

- 20 Week Benefit: Net profit \$3,278.84
- Turkey Supper: Net profit after adjustment for advertising is \$11,914.70.
- **Transfer of funds:** As of November 15, the following funds have been transferred to the Operating Fund: Turkey Supper and ECW 20 Week Benefit.
- **Wings:** Still waiting for bill from ECC for Women's retreat. This fund retains a \$300 balance to be used as a deposit on the Block Island Retreat.
- **One Time Event:** \$1,199.01 balance owed to the restricted checking account. We continue to pay \$500 monthly to make the account whole.
- **Capital Campaign:** \$7,527.60 owed to the restricted account. This amount is for cost overrun on the crossing walk. Per a previous Vestry *vote*, once the One Time Event expense is paid in full, \$500 will be paid each month until the balance is .00.

Budget vs. Actual Report

Income: The transfers noted *above* will be reflected on the November Vestry Budget *vs.* Actual and will be available at the December meeting.

Expenses: Advertising costs for the turkey supper are not reflected on this month's report however, the expenses will be on the November Budget *vs* Actual report.

Food Closet: All expected grant funds were not realized to dale. The food closet lncome/Expense report reflects a balance of \$1,510.17 in the black. We received some cash donations for the Thanksgiving baskets this weekend which will help defray some costs. The average total monthly expense for the Food Closet is \$925. With no significant income expected during the first quarter of 2020, the Food Closet may need to use funds in their reserve account or make adjustments to the amount of food that is being distributed to meet their expenses.

2018 Audit: Audit committee members have not met to date.

2020 Budget: The Finance committee continues to work on the budget. The next meeting is November 26 at 6:30 in the Library. Anyone who has not submitted a budget to date must do so immediately for the expenses to be considered for the coming fiscal year.

The Stewardship Committee was very busy this month. Our Blessing Jar activity collected **\$1,817.77**. This was definitely higher than what was expected. These funds will be contributed to this year's operating budget. We intend to conduct this event again next year about the same time of the year.

At the beginning of the month, we held a successful stewardship activity during the Men's Second Sunday Breakfast. Justin Greenough gave an inspiring stewardship talk before the Men's Breakfast to lead off the event. Our church members responded to a number of thought questions led by a table facilitator. (See the attached list of questions and the participants' responses.) We intend to use these responses to capture and reinforce the very positive feelings that our Trinity members feel towards our church community.

We continue sending our Stewardship letters centered on our theme: "Shining Our Light." We have sent letters from the rector, stewardship chair and the Senior Warden. This coming Sunday will be Harvest Sunday. We will be collecting the pledge cards for next year along with the Talent Surveys. Overall, our goal continues to be \$200,000 in pledges. This goal requires us to raise our pledge total by 9.9%. This amount should be an attainable goal for our congregation. It is a realistic total for providing a fundamental financial base without pressuring our congregation to be overly dependent on fund raising. Unfortunately, however, it has a fundamental challenge in that 27% of our church gives less than \$10 per week in pledges and 39% give less than \$20 per week. (Please see the attached Pledge Giving Chart.) A broader discussion needs to take place on how we can approach raising our average per person to attain the higher figure.

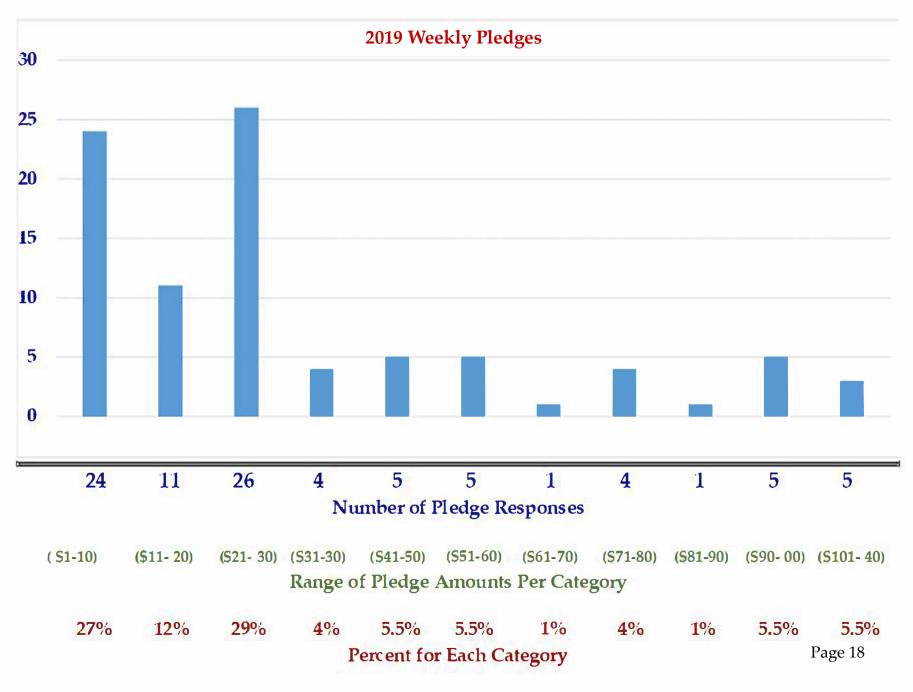

We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing; he chastens and hastens his will to make known; the wicked oppressing now cease from distressing, sing praises to his name: he forgets not his own. Sing a grateful alleluia.

Beside us to guide us, our God with us joining, ordaining, maintaining his kingdom divine; so from the beginning the fight we were winning: thou, Lord, at our side, all glory be thine!

The largest projects completed were the painting of the exterior of both the church and hall. I believe it had been 18 years since it was last painted and cleanup of the "stump dump"- an unsightly area located just to the side of the rectory. This area was created by the removal of trees damaged during a storm in November 2017.

The committee also worked in Aldrich Hall constructing a wall near the staircase to create greater storage and we replaced floor and ceiling tiles. We cleaned, painted & installed a new roof on the storage sheds and corrected drainage problems in that area. Throughout the summer we cut and trimmed the lawn from the Rectory to the Community Hall. Edging was installed along the church driveway to address erosion and with the help of volunteers we struggled to meet the constant need for weeding around the property.

Eric Peterson replaced rotted wood and refurbished windows in both the Undercroft and the rear of the church.

Estimates received on these projects totaled \$12,426. By completing some of the work ourselves, negotiating with vendors known to our committee members and donating materials, the final cost for these projects was \$8,100 yielding a savings of \$4,327 for the parish.

Some projects we are looking at in the coming year are repairs to the windows and stairs on Graham Hall, Painting the steeple, landscaping needs of the property including the area between the church and rectory and painting the interior of Graham Hall. All projects will be submitted to the Vestry for approval and pending availability of funds. Estimated costs for these tasks will be submitted to the budget committee. **Committee Members:** Shirley Hutchings, Renee Melaragno, Christopher Picozzi, Megan Picozzi, Jill Shurtleff, Mary Jane Smith, and Rev. Johanna Marcure, *ex-officio*.
